
Merry Thristmas

Daslen is a peasant from Camp Coq, a small town 7 miles south of Limbé, who was

admitted to the medical ward after the doctors, removed a huge pikan (wooden thorn) from his foot. He had been up the mountain to his garden to tie his cow to graze. As he was climbing down he stepped on this thorn and it pierced right through the sole of his foot. Sometimes the peasant farmers dig holes and place the spiked thorns on their land hoping to prevent thieves from entering into their gardens to steal the crops.

Because he did not come to the hospital for 5 days, his foot became badly infected and quite swollen. He had to

Marlene was admitted to the hospital because she had difficulty breathing. She was diagnosed with Tuberculosis so she will be here for awhile. She was put on IV's, oxygen and given antibiotics. After 2 weeks she was doing much better. She was taken off the oxygen, and was even able to eat a little bit of food. Her mother and sister helped care for her. She is just another of the many who come here seeking care and are so grateful that the hospital is here to offer them hope.

Food for the Tuberculosis Patients

We currently have over 70 registered TB Patients.

Every month a truck arrives with food supplies for our TB patients. HBS receives free food supplies from the UN World Food Program. They bring sacks of rice and beans, and oil which will be distributed to the TB patients enrolled in our care program. This means that the patients enrolled in our care program benefit from the free medicines and care from our free clinic to treat their TB, but also get month's supply of basic food provisions. We



are always glad to have outside help to provide for all the people that really need it.

We do get help to provide them with food and medicines but we need your help to be able to continue our free program to keep the TB under control.
