Youseline is a 5 year old girl who is in her first year of school. On her way to school she found a packet of matches, picked them up and put them in her pocket. During recess, she reached into her pocket to play with them. She took one, struck it and when it burst into a flame she was surprised and dropped it. The burning match fell on her dress and ignited the dress immediately. Suddenly she was enveloped in flames and screaming. Everyone came running to help put out the flames.



When she arrived at the hospital the whole front of her body was charred. They told the family to wait until the doctors could remove the burnt skin and dress the wounds. Every day they change the dressings on her wounds. She now resides in a private room with a mosquito net around her to keep out contamination from flies, etc. Each afternoon during visiting hours, her family and friends come to visit. HBS has been successful in treating burns like this. It is a very painful procedure, but the results are usually good. However it is needful to have daily exercises to keep the legs supple. In this picture the nurse is showing the father how to bend the leg slowly so the muscles will stay flexible. Youseline is so happy that she got a doll from the nurse to play with.

They made a lot of progress but there is still a lot to be done. The electrical work needs to be finished


